Open Access Knowledge Sharing



IFITT is dedicated to increasing the visibility of e-Tourism research. The ENTER24 proceedings will be indexed in Scopus, under the Springer Proceedings in Business and Economics series.

IFITT is working on securing sponsorships to publish the proceedings as an Open Access proceedings book published by Springer International. If successful, this initiative will give all ENTER24 authors even more visibility and impact. Since their publication, the ENTER23 e-Tourism Conference Proceedings have received 121k downloads and the ENTER22 e-Tourism Conference Proceedings have received more than 623k downloads. These numbers demonstrate the wide impact that the research presented at the ENTER conference can make in tourism research, education, and practice.

Submission Formats

Full Papers



We invite research papers across the wide spectrum of Information and Communication Technologies in travel, tourism, and hospitality management to be presented at the ENTER24 conference. Full papers should be innovative with the aim to advance the knowledge base of e-Tourism research. These papers present major contributions to the field.

- The maximum length for full papers is 12 pages, inclusive of references.
- All accepted full papers will be considered for awards and recognition, including the Best Full Paper prize, to be presented during the conference.
- All accepted full papers will be included in the Conference Proceedings published by Springer International Publishing under the Springer Proceedings in Business and Economics series.

Guidelines

Papers should clearly state the background, introduction, purpose, theory, methodology, results, and conclusions, and be fully referenced with appropriate citations. All full papers should emphasize future research directions at the end of each paper.

According to the Springer proceedings guidelines, all paper submissions should be prepared in Word or LaTeX. Please, find here the Word template and here the LaTex template to be used (other formats will not be accepted).

In addition to the main article file, all papers should be accompanied by a 200-word plain-language summary of the research results and impacts. When preparing this summary, please think of how you would present the results of your research to an industry professional or general (non-expert) audience. Short Papers



Short papers (research notes) are intended for highly promising findings of original and unpublished research ideas and preliminary results. The evaluation of short papers will be based on originality and (potential) importance rather than maturity or completed evaluation.

- The maximum length for short papers is 5 pages, inclusive of references.
- All accepted short papers will be considered for awards and recognition, including the Best Short Paper prize, to be presented during the conference.
- All accepted short papers will be included in the Conference Proceedings
 published by Springer International Publishing under the Springer Proceedings in
 Business and Economics series.

Guidelines

Papers should clearly state the background, introduction, purpose, theory, methodology, results, and conclusions, and be fully referenced with appropriate citations. All short papers should emphasize future research directions at the end of each paper.

According to the Springer proceedings guidelines, all paper submissions should be prepared in Word or LaTeX. Please, find here the Word template and here the LaTex template to be used (other formats will not be accepted).

Posters and Demos

- The maximum length for posters and demos submissions is 2 pages, inclusive of references
- All accepted posters and demos will be considered for awards and recognition, including the Best Poster & Demo prize, to be presented during the conference.
- All accepted posters and demos will be made available on the IFITT website in the Member Only area.

Guidelines

All posters and demos should be submitted as extended abstracts. The extended abstract should include the problem background, purpose, method, significance, or any other section that fits your particular submission type and the development stage.

Demo submissions must additionally provide a description of the demonstration that will be given at the conference (which may include screenshots and must include either a link to an online demo or to a video presenting it).

Students can also find answers to their academic and research career questions and expand their network with peers, researchers, industry, and universities from around the world. Journal editors will provide key tips on writing and submitting articles to leading academic journals.

Call for Ph.D. Workshop Proposals

The workshop invites highly motivated Ph.D. students to submit their research proposals for review and feedback.

Research proposals should be a maximum of five pages (A4) in length (including references) and should include the following headings:

- 1. Problem statement
- 2. Literature review
- 3. Conceptual framework
- 4. Proposed methodology
- 5. Expected results
- 6. References.

Guidelines

To successfully submit the proposals please follow the following steps:

Step 1: Download the Ph.D. Workshop Advice as a style guide

Step 2: Submit your proposal to EasyChair for ENTER24 (SELECT PhD Workshop).

After the review process, students will receive suggestions for improvement. Students with accepted proposals will be asked to prepare a 15-minute presentation.
